# Closing the gap project on attainment of PPG2 students GCSE 9-5

### Background to the 'Closing the gap' project

- School Improvement Strategy identified three key groups of focus for the year this included PPG2 students
- Ofsted report 2013 identified that the gap in attainment between PPG students and others was narrowing at a good rate but a few, small differences in the achievement of different groups of students or across different subjects remained.
- IDSR suggested that disadvantaged students were performing 10% below the national average for English Language 4+ (9-5) and 23% below the national average for English Literature 4+ (9-5)

#### Key project activities

- Identify PPG2 students in classes and ensure that staff know those students. Mark their books first.
- Identify students in class that are PPG2 ask staff to tell us who they will make the most difference with. What intervention strategies will they use to ensure good progress is made? Report this and KS4 c/o to monitor and check intervention strategies are working/successful
- Invite PPG2 students on a trip to Macbeth
- Parent information evening-how parents can help their children achieve – involving parents
- Resources put on L Drive and computers made available for PPG2 students if they needed them for revision purposes
- Extra revision sessions with PPG2 students personally invited

## Impact of 'closing the gap' project

- Ofsted report 2018 states that current progress of disadvantaged pupils has improved overall, particularly in English.
- Ofsted report 2018 states that 'current children who are looked after are achieving better than previously.'
- Summer 2018 results show improvement in performance – 58% of PPG2 students achieving 4+ in Language and 4% achieving 7+
- 68% achieving 4+ in Literature (increase of 32%).
- Mock results demonstrate improvement in results for Macbeth assessment after seeing the play via invitation
- Intervention strategy for PPG2 to continue with KS4 c/o monitoring which students we can make the most difference with and what successful strategies staff are using
- Continue to invite PPG2 students to performances
